RICHMOND- Senator R. Edward "Edd" Houck along with Delegates Bill Janis (R-Goochland) and Chris Peace (R-Hanover) met with officials from the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality, Virginia Department of Health, Dominion Virginia Power, and Harry Ruth for Friends of Lake Anna. A representative from Senator Ryan McDougle's (R-Hanover) office also attended the meeting.

"The purpose of the meeting was to bring the interested parties together to discuss the concerns of the Friends of Lake Anna", Houck said about the March 9th meeting.

The Friends of Lake Anna approached their state representatives several months ago about their concerns over the high water temperature on the "warm side" of the lake. The organization is comprised of hundreds of concerned citizens living near Lake Anna.

At that conclusion of the meeting, Houck was positive about its outcome. "Today's meeting showed the cooperative spirit of all parties and their interest in working for the betterment of our community. This meeting was the first of many as these discussions will continue over the upcoming months."
