

Senator Houck Receives 100% Score from the Virginia League of Conservation Voters

The Virginia League of Conservation Voters released its Legislative Conservation Scorecard this week announcing that Senator R. Edward “Edd” Houck received the only 100% score in the Virginia State Senate.

In response to learning of his score, Senator Houck said, “During my 25 year career in the State Senate, I am proud of my voting record and working relationship with the many conservation organizations throughout the Commonwealth. Our natural resources are one of Virginia’s treasures and we must do all we can to protect them.”

The scores are based on committee and floor votes during the 2008 General Assembly Session on a variety of conservation issues including uranium mining and greenhouse gas emissions.
